

MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS HELD OCTOBER 2, 1940  
AT 7:30 P. M.

The City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in a called meeting at the regular meeting place on October 2, 1940 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present:

and the following absent: G. E. Barington, Commissioner, Ward No. 3, and J. E. Jay, Commissioner, Ward No. 4.

1. This meeting having been duly called in accordance with law for the purpose of conducting a public hearing upon a proposed zoning ordinance, 36 citizens were present to have the plan explained and to enter such protests as they deemed necessary. The object of the zoning ordinance was explained by Ned Shands, Jr., City Attorney, who answered a number of questions asked by those present. The only objections were made by Lee Cummings and Sam H. Townsend, Sr. Mr. Townsend objected for the reason that he was opposed to the whole idea of a zoning ordinance, and Mr. Cummings objected for the reason that some property near his property was classified in such a way as to permit beer parlors. J. L. Reding wanted his property to be placed in a business district. All of the other people who were present at the meeting expressed their entire approval of the ordinance.



After all questions had been answered and all objections heard, there being nothing further to come before the meeting, it was upon motion duly made and carried, adjourned without passage of the ordinance, it being contemplated that the ordinance would be adopted as soon as it was possible to have the map prepared for printing.
