being present, and the following absent: J. W. Lewis,

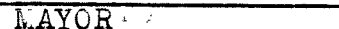
constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. Minutes of January Meetings were read and regularly approved.
2. Robert Denum and Wade Cunningham appeared before the Commission and requested the repair or replacement of City Street light, that had been destroyed in traffic accident, at street intersection between East Texas Laundry and Robert Denum's Ware House, and the Commission agreed that same would be re-installed.
3. The report of the Zoning Board for the City of Lufkin, recommending the granting of a permit to H. A. Maas to erect a temporary sheet iron garage at 701 Mantooth Avenue, was adopted and motion by Arthur Temple, Jr., and seconded by J. A. Abney that the said H. A. Maas be granted a permit to erect a temporary galvanized two car garage shelter, was unanimously adopted.
4. Application by Elzie Nash for taxi cab permit was discussed and the Commission found that there is a public necessity and convenience for such taxi cab, and motion by J. A. Abney and seconded by B. F. Milligan that taxi cab permit be issued to Elzie Nash was unanimously adopted, and that notice and public hearing be had on such application as provided by ordinance.
5. The matter of extending sewer and water lines to serve Southland Addition and surrounding area was discussed and it was agreed that the City of Lufkin would proceed with the necessary plans for such extensions and the Acting City Manager was instructed to make such plans and surveys as necessary to carry out such extensions.
6. Rat extermination to prevent the spread of Typhus Fever was discussed and it was agreed that the City would cooperate with the State Healty Department in putting on a program and campaign for the control and prevention of the spread of Typhus Fever.
7. No fruther business came before the Commission and the meeting was adjourned.
