constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

Minutes of all meetings held in August were read and approved.
J. E. Walker was present and asked that the City lay water and sewer lines in the new Walker Addition. He was told that it was customary for the developer to furnish one third of the cost of water and sewer lines in new additions and that he could make a contract to this effect with the City Manager.

Dexter Satterwhite and Glenn Burgess of the Airport Advisory Board were present to discuss Air Port improvements. The subject was discussed at length and it was decided to write Carter and Burgess, Engineers, for the Project, for further information.

Mr. Early announced that he was in receipt of a letter from the County Auditor, stating that the County Commission had voted to discontinue the Police Radio service from the City and that in the future, jail rent to the City would be \$50.00 (fifty dollars) per month. He was authorized to work out some agreement with the County concerning the matters.

It was pointed out that the City held a Tax Judgement against W. W. Smith and that all taxes had been paid but that the judgement had not been released. It was moved by B. F. Milligan and seconded by L. C. Martin that the judgement be released. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Typhus Control Program was discusssd, but no official action taken.

Upon recommendation of the City Manager, authorization to repaint the interior of the City Hall and purchase two new desk for use in the general office was made. It was further recommended that the City Advertise for bids and purchase one maintainer, one sack concrete mixer and 300' of paving forms, and one Fordson Tractor. Approval was given and date set for opening of bids for Monday, August 9, 1946, at 4:00 P. M.

No further business was presented, so the meeting adjourned.
