Passed by the following vote: Yeas: W. D. Winston, Jr., L. C. Martin, B. F. Milligan, E. A. Gibbs and D. M. Thrash. Nays: None. The resolution, as passed, is attached to and made a part of these minutes.

2. It was moved by D. M. Thrash and seconded by L. C. Martin that a resolution be passed authorizing condemnation proceedings against L. A. Lankford. Passed by the following vote: Yeas: W. D. Winston, Jr., L. C. Martin, B. F. Milligan, E. A. Gibbs and D. M. Thrash. Nays: None. The resolution, as passed, is attached to and made a part of these minutes.

3. It was moved by E. A. Gibbs and seconded by L. C. Martin, that a resolution be passed authorizing condemnation proceedings against Mrs. A. Stroud, Jack Stroud, Ashley Stroud, Elizabeth Stroud Stegall, and Husband, Joe Stegall. Passed by the following vote: Yeas: W. D. Winston, Jr., L. C. Martin, B. F. Milligan, E. A. Gibbs and D. M. Thrash. Nays: None. The resolution, as passed, is attached to and made a part of these minutes.

4. Mr. Early reported that the CMC Concrete Mixer that had been previously approved for purchase did not have a four-cylinder engine and that he would like to change his recommendation to go back to the low bid on the Jacger Mixer and purchase from the Browning-Ferris Machinery Co., as this was the type of Mixer best suited to the Citys' needs. Motion was made by D. M. Thrash and seconded by B. F. Milligan to purchase the Jacger Mixer. The motion carried by unahimous vote. Mr. Early also stated that he had been unable to purchase flexible, curved, concrete forms and that he would like to purchase the standard 90-degree curve forms, after which, motion was made by B. F. Milligan and seconded by D. M. Thrash to purchase the forms. It was further pointed out that the City needed a Dump truck and that an International could be delivered at an earlier date than other trucks. It was moved by L. C. Martin and seconded by D. M.
