July bills were approved to be paid, motion Zeagler, Second Snell. Payment of \$251.05 to Howard Walker for Right-of-way work done for Highways 69 and 94 was approved, motion by Commissioner Snell, seconded by Commissioner Zeagler.

4 It was voted by the Commission that all of the Right-of-way proper had been acquired by the City for Highways 69 and 94.

- 5 The Commission was advised that W. C. Binion would serve on the Tax Equalization Board. The other two members, Johnny Frank Medford and Fred Hutson, were appointed by the ommission.
- Reference was made by the Commission to the minutes of the Commission meeting of May 10, 1949, wherein a Garbage Collection Ordinance was passed and wherein, also, a resolution authorizing the City to borrow \$108,600.00 from the Lufkin National Bank, payable \$2,400.00 plus interest per month, was passed. It is the present intent of the Commission to emphasize that the revenue derived from the garbage collection fees was obligated only to the extent of \$2,400.00 plus interest per month, and not the full amount collected on garbage collection fees.
- The City Attorney Brazil presented the milk ordinance and it was passed on second reading, motion by Commissioner Stegall, seconded by Commissioner Zeagler.
- The amendment to the sewer ordinance was presented by City Attorney Brazil and passed on second reading, motion by Commissioner Treadwell, second by Commissioner Stegall.

4 A new contract with the Texas Power and Light Company providing a lower electric rate on water pumping was accepted on motion of Commissioner Stegall, seconded by Commissioner Zeagler.

The Commission ordered a "No Truck" sign at the intersection of South Raguet with Highway 59.

A petition requesting reinstatement of A. J. Middleton as Policeman was presented by the Mayor. The Commission elected to follow the recommendation of the City Manager in retiring Mr. Middleton.
