AN ORDINANCE
 Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas, that hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 21 years to enter into and remain in any house or place of business where any spirituous, vinous or malt liquors are sold, or where any ten-pin or box-ball, or other bacquet alley is operated, or into any pool or billiard hall, located within the city of Lufkin, Texas, and any such person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon a conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than ten dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars.
