MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL, Lufkin, Texas, Meeting 10-21st 1910

Be it remembered that on this the 21st day of October A. D. 1910 there came on and was held a ^{REGULAR} ~~SPECIAL CALL~~ Meeting of the Honorable City Council of the City of Lufkin, in the Council Chamber of said city, there being present and presiding the following officers:

When the following proceedings, among others, were had, to-wit:

Canvassing Returns and Declaring Results of Election.

At a meeting of the City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas, held on the 21st. day of October, 1910, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 8th day of October, 1910, to determine whether or not the bonds of said city should be issued to the amount of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18000.00) bearing interest at the rate of five per cent, payable in forty years from date, for the purpose of improving and extending the water-works system of the said city of Lufkin, Texas, and whether or not a tax shall be annually levied, assessed and collected in said city sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and to provide the required sinking fund to redeem them at maturity, and it appearing that said election was in all respects lawfully held, and said returns duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 156 votes, of which number 79 votes were cast "for the issuance of the bonds" and 77 votes "were cast "against the issuance of the bonds"

It is therefore ordered and declared that the proposition to issue said bonds and levy said tax was sustained by a majority of the qualified property taxpayers voting at said election, and that the City Council of said City is authorized to issue said bonds and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax.

The purpose of the meeting as explained by the Mayor, being to canvass the returns and declare the results of the election held on Oct 8th, said returns having been in all respects duly and legally made and approved by Bledsoe, and all declared
