That the following ordinance be passed and adopted:

An ordinance authorizing the State Comptroller to cancel an issue of Bonds, known and registered as " City of Lufkin, water-works improvements bonds, dated November 1st., 1910, due and payable forty years from that date, with ten years option, there being twenty-two(22) of them numbered consecutively from one to twenty-two, inclusive, of the denomination of (\$500.00) Five Hundred Dollars each, aggregating the sum of, Eleven Thousand(\$11,000.00)Dollars.

And to annul and repeal the ordinance, passed and adopted by this Council under date of October 21st., 1910, authorizing the above issue of Bonds.

Where-as, it appearing that an error was occasioned in arriving at the proper amount of Bonds the taxing power of the City of Lufkin, Texas, would support when working up the above issue of bonds, and it appearing that the taxing power of the said City would support an issue amounting to Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred(\$14,500.) Dollars; therefore: (1) Be it ordained by the City of Lufkin, Texas That the State comptroller be ordered and directed, and he is hereby ordered and directed to cancel the aforesaid issue of Eleven Thousand (\$11,000)Dollars bonds, dated November, 1st., 1910, bearing 5% five per cent interest, due forty years from date, and redeemable at the pleasure of the City after ten years, and the ordinance authorizing

the issuance of same is hereby repealed and nullified and revoked.

That the following ordinance be passed and adopted:

An ordinance authorizing an issue of bonds for the purpose of improve-

ing and expanding the water-work system of the City of Walker, Texas,

and providing for the levy and collection of a tax to pay the interest

and create a sinking fund for the redemption of said bonds at maturity.

Whereas, an election held for the purpose on the 8th,

day of October, 1910, a majority of the qualified voters who are

property tax payers of the City of Walker, Texas, voting at said

election, sustained the proposition to issue bonds hereinafter describ-

ed by a vote of 79 for the issuance of bonds, to a vote of 77 against

the issuance of bonds hereinafter described, therefore,

(1) Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Walker, Texas,

that the bonds of said City be called, "City of Walker, Water-works

Improvement Bonds", to be issued under and by virtue of Article 486

Revised Statutes of Texas, 1896, as amended in 1909, for the purpose

of extending and improving the water-work system of said City.

(2) Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from one to twenty-nine

inclusive, shall be of the denomination of (\$500) Five Hundred Dollars

each, aggregating the sum of Fourteen thousand, Five Hundred (\$14,500)

Dollars.

(3) They shall be dated the first day of November, 1910, shall become

due and payable forty years from that date, but may be redeemed at the

pleasure of the City at any time after ten years from that date.

(4) They shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the First day of November, and the First day of May of each year.

(5) Principal and interest shall be payable on presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons at New York, City, New York.

(6) Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Secretary, registered by the Treasurer, and the Seal of the City shall be impressed upon each of them.

(7) The Fac-simile signature of the mayor and the City Secretary may be lithographed on the coupons.

(8) It is further ordained by the City Council that to pay the interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to discharge them at maturity, a tax of ^{Seven} (.07) cents on the each one hundred dollars valuation of all taxable property in said City of Iufkin, shall be annually levied on the said property and annually assessed and collected until said bonds and interest are paid, and said tax of Seven (.07) cents on the one hundred dollars out of a tax of twenty five (25) cents levied for interest and sinking fund on outstanding bonds by this Council on the 5th, day of December A. D. 1911, the ordinance making such levy being of record on page 23&24 of book two (2) of the minutes of this Council is hereby appropriated and set aside to pay the interest and create the necessary sinking fund for the current year, and shall be assessed and collected and so applied; and said tax is hereby levied for each year hereafter while said bonds are outstanding and the same shall be annually assessed and collected and applied for the purpose named.

(9) It is also ordained that the Mayor be authorized to take and have charge of said bonds pending their investigation by the attorney General and upon their approval and registration shall have the authority to negotiate their sales and receive for the City the proceeds there-of.
