SUBJECT: Minutes of Regular Meeting October 5th. 1915.

Be it known that on this the 5th. day of October A.D. 1915 there came on and was held a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas in the Chamber Halls of said City there being present the following Officers:-

T. C. Mantooth, Mayor. J. F. Davis, Alderman,
S. W. Hawthorne, Alderman, W. D. Price, Alderman,
T. A. Behanon, Alderman. P. A. McCarthy, Engineer,
E. A. Perkins, Sanitary Ins. S. R. Sayers, Attorney.
H. B. Satterfield, Secretary.

When the following business was had to wit:-

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

Mr. F. D. L. Kimmey appeared before the Council supporting a petition for opening a street through the Everett sub-division, where-up-on Alderman Price moved, and Alderman Behanon seconded that Mayor Mantooth and Attorney Sayers visit the sight with the view of getting the street opened.

Engineer McCarthy submitted an ordinance ~~for the~~ #88 entitled "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY ENGINEER TO REVISE AND REESTABLISH THE GRADE ALONG THE WESTERLY FRONT LOTS 8 and 9 IN BLOCK NO 4 AND TO ISSUE A PERMIT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SAID SIDEWALK." It was moved by Alderman Price seconded by Alderman Behanon that the above ordinance be adopted as read, all aldermen voting "AYE".

Mr. Cotton appeared before the Council as the representative of the Texas Bitulithic Company and submitted drafts of ordinances for the amendment of ordinances No. 54, 55, 56, 57 and 58, where-up-on Alderman Price moved and Alderman Behanon seconded that ordinances No. 90, 91, 92, 93 and 94, the same being the proposed amended ordinances be passed as read. All Aldermen voted "AYE"

Report of Poundmaster Nerren read and approved.

Report of Poundmaster Nerren reporting two dogs disposed of read and approved.

Report of Tax Assessor and Collector Medford read and approved

Report of Street Commissioner read and approved.

Mr. C. W. Bridges appeared before the Council submitting his claim against the City for the death of one hog alleged to have been killed by overhear while in the custody of the City Marshall. Where-up-on motion of Alderman Price the claim was referred to the City Attorney for a tentative and report.

Alderman Price moved, which motion was seconded by Alderman Davis that the claim of Rowe and Company amounting to \$51.50 for laying water pipe in North Lufkin Addition be paid out of the General Fund.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following claims were allowed:-

J. B. Champion filed an affidavit for the loss of warrant No. 837 amounting to \$7.00 where-up-on it was moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Behanon that said warrant No. 837 be cancelled and that a duplicate be issued in lieu thereof.

W. C. Fuller and other citizens presented a petition and a subscription list for the appointment of Charles Ellis to the Office of Night Marshall where-upon it was moved by Alderman Davie and seconded by Alderman Behanon that said Charles Ellis be appointed Night Marshall and that his salary be fixed as \$ 25.00. All Aldermen voting "AYE"

The City Engineer reported that the Lufkin Sanitary Sewer Corporation wholly failed to repair the cave in of its sewer line on Ra get Street as ordered by the Council at the last meeting where-upon it was moved by Alderman Price and Seconded by Alderman Davis that the City Attorney be directed to notify the said Lufkin Sanitary Sewer Corporation that unless the repairs were made as directed, that the Council would cancel would their franchise, all Aldermen voting "AYE".

It was moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Behanon that the Mayor be instructed to remove the obstructions placed across the right of way on the North Side of its railroad along Angelina Avenue and Firxst Street, all Aldermen voting "AYE"

There being no further business to come before the council, and upon motion duly made, the Council adjourned until October 6th. at 8 P.M.
