Be it remembered that on this the 3rd day of July, A.D. 1934, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:- C. A. Burke, Mayor, W. O. Greene, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, Louis Hicks, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, D. A. Campbell, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W. A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, R. C. Musslewhite, City Attorney, and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary and Acting City Manager, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of all meeting held during the Month of June, were read, and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

Mrs. R. E. Minton and Mrs. Mary L. Porter appeared before the City Commission in behalf of the hay-fever sufferes of the city. They stated that the contributing cause of hay-fever was the polen from the rag-weed, and that such weed was growing in great numbers within the city limits as well as out, and requested that a rag-weed cutting campaign be organized. The matter was considered and on recommendated action was deferred until an organization could be organized by the hay-fever sufferers, and others interested, looking to the promulgation of such a campaign, but promised some financial aid to such organization. (Later such organization was perfected at a meeting at which the Mayor and City Manager were present, and at said meeting a sum not to exceed \$200.00 was promised. The campaign was put on and and actual sum of \$193.10 was donation to the organization.).

M. D. Calhoun and wife appeared before the City Commission and demanded a sum of \$1,000.00 be paid them for damages claimed by them to have accrued against their property by reason of the opening up and paving of Demman Avenue Extension from S. Angelina to S. First Street. It was agreed that members of the City Commission go to the property and look same over for the purpose of determining whether in their opinion said parties were entitled to any damages. They did look over the property and came to the conclusion that the amount asked was entirely to much, but stated they would be willing to pay a sum not to exceed \$200.00. They, the said M.D.Calhoun and wife refused to accept said amount.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF EQULIXATION IN AND FOR THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, FOR THE YEAR 1934" was introduced for passage and approval on first read-

ing. W. O. Greene made a motion that same be placed on first reading and that it pass first reading. The motion was seconded by W.A. Abney. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion. "Ayes" + C.A.Burke, W.O.Greene, Louis Hicks, D.A. Campbell and W. A. Abney. "Noes" - None - Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said ordinance passed and approvedon first reading.

An Ordinance entitled-

"AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING THE TAXES TO BE LEVIED, ASSESSED AND COLLECTED BY THE GITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, FOR THE YEAR 1934 AND FOR EACH YEAR THEREAFTER UNTIL OTHERWISE PROVIDED"

was introduced for passage and approval on first reading. W. A. Abney made a motion that said ordinance be placed on first reading and that it pass first reading. The motion was seconded by Louis Hicks. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on said motion. "Ayes"— C.A.Burke, W.O.Greene, Louis Hicks, D.A.Campbell and W.A.Abney. "Noes"— None.— Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said ordinance passed and approved on first reading.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
