The purpose of the meeting was to meet ~~with~~ and discuss with representatives of Texas Relief Commission the question of providing office and warehouse space for further use by the Commission, since District Headquarters were not located in Lufkin. After hearing the matter thoroughly discussed and explained the city commission on a unanimous vote after motion was made by Louis Hicks and seconded by W.A. Abney provided that ^{Temporary} office space would be provided in the log building located on the Tyler Hotel lot, conditioned that 2 or 3 rooms would be used by the Federal Resettlement Commission, and that present warehouse facilities be maintained ^{temporarily} and that the present arrangement for sewing room headquarters remain the same, ^{temporarily}.
