

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE CITY
COMMISSION HELD MAY 21, 1935.

Be it remembered that on this the 21st day of May, A.D. 1935, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission in and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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The purpose of the meeting was to discuss and if possible adopt a tentative budget for the City for year 1935-1936, and to do and perform any other duties that might properly come before the meeting.

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A tentative budget was prepared and ordered published.

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A resolution entitled "Resolution authorizing Mayor and Secretary to execute agreement to maintain from year to year a portion of Raguet Street, (North) from Abney Avenue to City Limits if same is improved by the State Highway Department, was introduced for passage and approval. On motion by W.A. Abney and second by Louis Hicks it was carried unanimously that said resolution be passed and approved. (See another page of these minutes for a record of said resolution.

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A resolution providing that the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, that in consideration of the State Highway Department of the State of Texas and the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Agriculture of the United States of America constructing Highway No 40 over a portion of State Highway No 40 from ~~the~~ Abney Avenue North to the City Limits, said City of Lufkin agrees ~~to~~ not to permit encroachment on the right of way, nor pass any ordinance or law fixing the speed limit under twenty miles per hour, nor will it allow the erection of signs, semaphores, and signales that will give preference to local routes which intersect with said above mentioned street. Said ordinance was introduced for passage and motion duly made and carried was unanimously passed. (See another page of these minutes for a record of said ordinance.)

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
