Burke, it was unanimusly ordered that proper "Memorium" be drawn and signed by officers of the City of Lufkin, and placed in the minutes of this City Commission. It was moved by D.A. Campbell and seconded by Louis Hicks that said ordinance be placed on first reading and that it pass first reading.
