MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD FEBRUARY 2nd, A.D. 1937.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of February, A.D. 1937,
there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the
City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the fol-
lowing officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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Minutes of meetings held during the month of January, A.D. 1937, were
read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

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Dr. Denman C. Hucherson, newly appointed City Health Officers was pres-
esnt and thanked the City Commission for appointing him to such a position
and made the statement that it was his desire and wish to fully co-operate
in every way possible in the interest of the health of the city and re-
quested that he be called upon when needed. In his talk he mentioned that
he had been talked to about the use of the so-called "dry privies" in the
city in that they were in a very unsanitary condition and were a menace to
health. He especially called attention to the use of such a privy at a
residence near Kurth Grammar School, being used by Mr. J.M.Meyers and fami-
ly. He thought it ought to be abated or eliminated and an approved State
Health Department Pit Privy or a connection to the sewer be made, because
of the fact that so many school children were necessarily so near same a
lot of the time. City Attorney Curtis W. Fenley was instructed to take
necessary legal steps to have something done that would eliminate this par-
ticular hazard.

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W. M. Glenn, representing the "Child Welfare Board" of Angelina County
was present and presented a plan for the operation and maintenance of a
"Child Nursery" which would be partly supported by the Federal Government.
After hearing the matter discussed and after many questions were asked and
answered it was moved by W. O. Greene and seconded by H. E. Jay that the
sum of \$600.00 be appropriated by the City to aid in the support and main-
tenance of same. The motion carried unanimously.

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Accounts and bills due by the City to various parties, firms and

340 corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly audited and approved by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried were ordered paid.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, ~~were~~ adjourned.
