It is hereby ordered, that of Hampshire City Assessor & Collector be allowed the use of the City Fire Department's House for this office provided he will in no way interfere or conflict with the Dept. Fire Dept.

The following Ordinance was passed by an unanimous vote of those present -

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Suffolk Tex that hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person firm or corporation in the City of Suffolk to place or cause to be placed upon any of the streets or sidewalks or alleys in said City any paper, paper boxes, wooden boxes, tin cans, or any substance of like character and it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to allow substance such as is enumerated above, to remain on the streets or sidewalks adjacent to the property and any person, firm or corporation violating these ordinances shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in a sum of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, provided that any person, firm or corporation shall not be deemed to have violated this ordinance when they place said substances on the streets for the purpose of having same immediately
