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MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD JUNE 4th. A. D. 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 4th day of June, A.D. 1929, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall in said City, with the following officers of the City Present: Joe C. Denman, Mayor, C. E. Brazil, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, C. A. Burke, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, R. C. Jordan, Commissioner of Ward No. 3 and W. A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V. R. Smitham, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:--

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Minutes of former meetings of the City Commission read and approved on motion duly made and carried.

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An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS, GRANTING TO DIXIE GAS & FUEL COMPANY THE RIGHT AND PRIVILEGE AND FRANCHISE TO LAY GAS MAINS ALONG THE STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DISTRIBUTING AND SELLING NATURAL GAS OR MANUFACTURED GAS TO THE INHABITANTS OF SAID CITY AND TO OTHERS; AND ALSO TO LAY PIPE LINES IN THE STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS, HIGHWAYS, ROADS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES AND GROUNDS OF SAID CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONVEYING NATURAL GAS OR MANUFACTURED GAS THROUGH AND WITHIN SAID CITY FOR DISTRIBUTING NATURAL GAS OR MANUFACTURED GAS TO THE INHABITANTS OF SAID CITY, AND TO OTHERS BEYOND THE LIMITS OF SAID CITY OF LUFKIN, ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS, BOTH FOR INDUSTRIAL AND DOMESTIC PURPOSES AND PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID GAS DISTRIBUTIONS SYSTEM" was presented for passage and approval on first reading. C. E. Brazil made a motion that said ordinance be placed on first reading and that same pass first reading. Said motion was seconded by C. A. Burke. The Mayor put the question and requested all those members of the City Commission who favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "NO". The following is the Vote: "Ayes"-- Joe C. Denman, C. E. Brazil, C. A. Burke, R. C. Jordan and W.A. Abney. "NOES" None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said ordinance passed on first reading.

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It appearing to the City Commission that that portions of four streets or avenues, viz:

- (1) Douglass Avenue from its intersection with the south line of Abney Avenue to its intersection with the north line of Kiln Avenue;
 - (2) Jefferson Avenue from its intersection with west line of Trout Addition to its intersection with east line of Bynum Street;
 - (3) South End Boulevard from its intersection with the east line of South First Street to its intersection with west line of Kinney Street;
 - (4) Bynum Street from its intersection with south line of Kiln Avenue to its intersection with south line of Ellis Avenue;
- have been completed according to contract for street paving with

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Scott Shambaugh of Houston, Texas, of date Aug. 24th, A.D. 1928, and the acceptance of said avenues or streets have been recommened in writing by City Manager and City Engineer, V.R. Smitham; on motion C.A. Burke, seconded by W.A. Abney, all voting yea, said avenues or streets were accepted from Scott Shambaugh, paving contractor, and said improvement on said avenues or streets are now received and accepted by the City.

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It appearing that five members of the fire department had been elected as deligates to the State Firemen's Convention at Galveston, Texas, it was ordered that the sum of \$25.00 be allowed to each of five deligates as aforesaid as expenses in attending said convention.

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The City Manager reported that he wished to appoint H.C. Billingsley as a member of the police department, and asked that such action be confirmed by the City Commission. On motion of C.A. Burke seconded by R. C. Jordan the City Manager was instructed to make said appointment and that same would be confirmed by the City Commission. The Motion carried unanimoously.

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All bills and accounts due by the City to various parties firms and corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly approved by the City Manager should be paid, it was ordered that warrants be issued in payment of same.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
