Be it remembered that on this the 6th day of November, A. D. 1934, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of all meetings held during the month of October, 1934, were read, and on motion duly made and carried, were approved as read.

Mr. D.A. Campbell, stated that he would like to have an order entered on the Minutes to the effect that improvements on any City property located within the City Limits of the City of Lufkin, made in connection with the National Housing Bill would not be assessed for Advalorem Taxes. On motion duly made and carried it is so ordered.

A Representative of the Sinclair Refining Company appeared before the City Commission and asked for an option on the plot of land on South First Street belonging to the City of Lufkin, being a part of the land purchased from J.E. Wilson and wife. The matter was considered and it was moved by D.A. Campbell and seconded by Louis Hicks that a sixty day option be given, the price to be fully set forth in option contract, and Curtis W. Fenley, City Atterney was instructed to prepare same. The motion carried unanimously.

The matter of purchasing a lot to lease to the U.S.Government on which to beuild offices for the C.C. Camps was considered and it appearing that a suitable lot could be bought from the W.H.Bonner Hairs at a price of \$400.00, it was moved by W.O. Greene and second by D.A. Campbell that the purchase be made when it was made fully known that said U.S.Government would use it. Carried unanimously.
