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MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD ON MAY 6, 1946,
AT 2:30 P. M.

On this, the 6th. day of May, 1946, A. D., the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in a called session, in the regular meeting place in said City, with the following members thereof to-wit:

being present, with W. D. Winston, Jr., Mayor, absent: thus constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. It was pointed out that North Seventh Street, South of Cotton Belt Railroad was not being used for street purposes and that it was needed for industrial construction. The matter was discussed and motion made by E. A. Gibbs and seconded by L. C. Martin to close the street. The motion carried by unanimous vote of yea.

2. General discussions were held on the following subjects: but no official action taken: Right of way for Farm to Market Roads; Rejection of Swimming Pool application: Oiling streets, Water line in New Park; Garbage schedule. It was moved by D. M. Thrash and seconded by E. A. Gibbs to double the amount of all building, plumbing and electrical fees. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

3. The following Zone changes applications were read: Warren Alfred change portion of C to H. Clarence Williams, portion of B to F. Tyler Transit Co., portion of F to H. R. L. Perkins portion of B to F, all of which were recommended by the Zoning Board. Other applications read, but had been rejected by the Zoning board were those of: Mose Buck, E. J. Conn, H. A. Haley, Arnett Green and O. V. Tatum, which were applications to change residential property to Commercial. After hearing the applications read, it was moved by E. A. Gibbs and seconded by L. C. Martin, that they be acted upon as recommended by the Zoning Board. The motion carried by unanimous vote of yea and authorization for publication was made and public hearing set for May 14, 1946 at 3:00 P. M.

4. Without formal action, Mr. Lewis was authorized to purchase enough Right of way from M. M. Cowser as needed for construction of farm to market highway in front of Mr. Cowser's property on Lufkin Avenue.

No further business was presented, so the meeting adjourned.
