MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD July 5th, 1935.

Be it remembered that on this the 5th day of July, A.D. 1935, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

W. O. Greene,	Commissioner Ward No. 1, and Mayor Pro Tem.
Louis Hicks,	Commissioner Ward No. 2,
D. A. Campbell,	Commissioner Ward No. 3,
W. A. Abney,	Commissioner Ward No. 4,
Curtis W. Fenley,	City Attorney, and
T. L. Dunn,	City Secretary and Acting City Manager.

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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The purpose of the meeting was to declare result of Special Election for Mayor; to read and approve bills, and to receive bids for City Depository, and to transact any other business that might properly come before the meeting.

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An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF AN ELECTION HELD WITHIN AND FOR THE CITY OF LUFKIN ON THE 2nd DAY OF JULY, A.D. 1935, for THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR IN AND FOR SAID CITY, was introduced for passage and approval. The said ordinance having been read to the City Commission, it was moved by W.A. Abney and seconded by Louis Hicks that said ordinance be passed and approved. The following is the recorded vote on the motion: "Ayes"- W.O. Greene, Louis Hicks, D.A. Campbell and W.A. Abney.- "Noes"- None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said ordinance approved and passed.

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Immediately upon the passage and approval of the above named ordinance the Mayor elect, Kenneth Hoskins was sworn into office by having administered to him the official oath of office, and he at once took the the chair and presided the remaining part of the meeting.

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One bid was received, that of the First State Bank & Trust Company, for City Depository, they bidding 1% on daily balances. After considering said bid, on motion by D.A. Campbell seconded by Louis Hicks, action on same was passed until next meeting.

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Mr. C. D. Jessup, Jr, representing the firm of Jessup & Jessup, Attorneys-at-Law, 1427 Esperson Building, Houston, Texas, was present,

and explained the methods etc used in collection of delinquent taxes, and represented that his firm would be glad to enter into a contract with the City to perform such service. No action was taken on the matter but was left open for further consideration and study.

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Mr. E.L. Kurth and Ed C. Burris were present in behalf of a matter looking to the determination of whether a sufficient water supply could be developed to operate a paper mill. The matter was received for consideration and it was decided to consider seriously the question and to begin investigations as to what the cost of making the necessary tests would be.

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Bills and accounts due by the City various parties, firms and corporations were presented and read to the City Commission, and it appeared that such of said bills has been properly approved for payment by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried were allowed.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried it adjourned.
