

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD DECEMBER 20,
1955, AT 7:30 P.M.

On this the 20th day of December, A. D. 1955,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened
in regular session, in the regular meeting place in
said City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

being present, and the following absent: Granville Wright,
Commissioner, Ward 1 _____, constituting a quorum when the follow-
ing business was transacted:

1. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor Woodrow W. Scott.
2. The minutes of the regular meeting of December 6, 1955, were read and approved.
3. A committee with R. V. Welch as spokesman, appeared before the Commission and recommended that the City Lake Property be made into a recreation center. It was agreed that a master plan for the use of the Lake and area would be worked out and submitted to the Commission at a later meeting.
4. O. L. Finley on behalf of the Society of Crippled Children came before the Commission and requested the temporary use of one-half of the Community Center Building, located in the City Park, for the use of the crippled children of this area. He informed the City Commission that a therapist would be in charge to assist the crippled children. The request for such use of the building was granted.
5. Mr. Anderson, Superintendent of the City Schools, appeared and discussed an adequate fireworks ordinance for the City. The City Attorney was instructed to draw an appropriate ordinance covering the sale and discharge of fireworks in the City.

6. Bids were opened for the sale of the timber on the Jones Lake and City Lake Property, as previously advertised. Two bids were received - one from Angelina County Lumber Company in the sum of \$3,395.00, and one from Southern Pine Lumber Company in the sum of \$5,419.20. Southern Pine Lumber Company being the highest and best bidder for such marked timber, its bid was accepted and the timber sold to it for the sum of \$5,419.20.

7. The City agreed to purchase Lots No.'s 16 and 17, in Block No. 16, Original Town of Lufkin, Texas, in accordance with its option agreement with Mrs. LaReine Anderson.

8. The water rate ordinance was passed by the Commission on second and final reading.

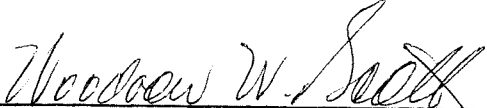
9. The City Manager was authorized to take options on sites for two additional water towers to be erected in the City.

10. The City Manager was granted permission to invest the bond money on hand for a period of ninety (90) days.

11. Braker Alexander was granted two permits for the operation of taxicabs within the City.

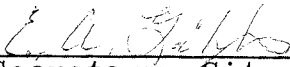
12. Bills for the month of November were approved and ordered paid.

ORDER FOR THE CITY'S GENERAL ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS §

CITY OF LUFKIN §

WHEREAS, on the 7th day of February, A.D., 1956, the City Commission passed an Ordinance and order calling for a general election to be held in the City of Lufkin on the first Tuesday in April, A.D., 1956, the same being the 3rd day thereof, for the purpose of electing a Commissioner from Ward Number Two and a Commissioner from Ward Number Four in said City of Lufkin.

That in accordance with said Ordinance passed and adopted by the City Commission, said election shall be held at the Central Fire Station located on Lufkin Avenue in the said City of Lufkin on the 3rd day of April, A.D., 1956, and said election shall be held in accordance with the General Election Laws of the State of Texas, and only resident qualified voters of said City shall be eligible to vote at said election.

The City Secretary shall give notice of said election by posting three copies of this notice and the Ordinance ordering such election, which notices shall be posted not less than thirty days prior to the date fixed for said election.

That immediately after said election is held, the officers holding such election shall make returns of the result thereof to the City Commission as provided by the City Charter of the City of Lufkin.
