MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF
THE CITY OF LUFKIN,
TEXAS, HELD APR.
4th, 1933.

Be it remembered that on this the 4th day of April, A.D. 1933, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission in and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the office present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

-----oOo-----

Minutes of all meetings heald during the month of March, A.D. 1933, were read and on motion duly made and carried, were approved as read.

-----oOo-----

It was called to the attention of the City Commission that there was a probability of the usual appropriation which has heretofore been made by the State Legislature to maintain and support a State Firemen's Training School being abandoned.

It was moved by W.A. Abney and seconded by M.M. Jones, that a resolution be prepared protesting the abandonment of such appropriation, and that a copy of same be sent to both, State Senator, John S. Redditt, and Representative, John W. Laird, requesting them to vote for and use their best efforts in behalf of such appropriation. The motion carried unanimously. (Note: Such resolution was not prepared, for the reason that the number of the bill and draft of same could not be obtained. An effort was made to get a copy of the bill, but Representative Laird stated that he did not have the bill available, if one had been prepared. He stated however, that such appropriation if allowed, would be in the Annual Appropriation allowed the A&M. College.

The matter of completing the right-of-way on Highway No. 40 within the City Limits so that the State Highway Department could take same over for construction and maintenance was discussed, and on motion made by C.A. Burke which was seconded by W.A. Abney, it was unanimously carried that City Attorney Musslewhite and Acting City Manager Dunn have field notes prepared and deeds drawn conveying such property and if possible get such deeds executed.

City Attorney Musslewhite suggested that an analysis of the effluent at the City Sewerage Plant should be made in order to be prepared to defend a suit for damages now pending in the District Court. It was ordered that it be ascertained where such analysis could be secured and what the cost of same would be.

It was recommended that a new truck be bought to be used in the garbage department of the City; the old one having worn out. The matter was thoroughly discussed, and it was moved by C.A. Burke and seconded by W.A. Abney that a Chevrolet Truck be bought. The motion carried unanimously.

Accounts and bill due to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment, and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly audited and approved by the City Manager should be paid, by move and second duly made and carried same were allowed.

-----oOo-----

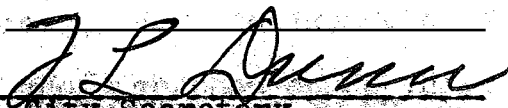
There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, same adjourned.
