MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
held ~~October~~ November 30th, 1935.

Be it remembered that on this the 30th day of November, A.D. 1935,
there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission in and
for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with
the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The Mayor stated that he had received two letters relative to the
refunding program now under way by the City, one from W.D. Collins Bank
Fixture Co, Denison, Texas and one from James & Stayant, Bond and In-
vestments, Dallas, Texas. The two letters were read and by order of
the city Commission were turned over to the City Manager to answer with
instructions to answer same, directing the writers to C.W. Austin, fis-
cal Agent for the City in the refunding plan, for any further correspon-
dence in connection with the plan.

Mr. Curtis W. Fenley, Chairman of the Safety Committee reported
and filed with the City commissioners and written report of the recom-
mendations of the committee. The report was listened to with inter-
est but insofar as acting on it, it was passed to the regular meeting,
November 5th, 1935, for further consideration.

The question of keeping or retaining permanently on the police
force, a special officer for traffic duty was considered and discussed.
After the discussion of the question it was moved by W.A. Abney and sec-
onded by Louis Hicks that the special officer in the person of R. A.
McCarley be retained on the police force permanently and that his sala-
ry be the same as other police officers, to-wit \$120.00 per month until
further notice or until the close of the fiscal year. The motion car-
ried *by a majority vote, D.A. Campbell voting "no"*

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on
motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
