MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE  
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,  
HELD OCTOBER 19th, 1935.

Be it remembered that on this the 19th day of October, 1935, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The matter of the purchase from J. W. Shotwell of the North one-half of Lot No. 6 in Block No. 22 was again discussed, after which it was decided that the city should purchase same at a price of \$875.00 and to pay the cost of an Abstract of said property, with the understanding that the said J. W. Shotwell would pay all taxes due on all property known as the U.M. Brown property, including the taxes on lots 23 and 24 of Block No. 16 and the brick building located thereon.

B. L. Zeagler owner and operator of the Zeagler Saw Mill made requisition through the Mayor for a special officers Commission to be issued to J. W. Cahmablee, an employee, (Night Watchman) of said Zeagler Saw Mill in order that he might have official recognition and power to see that all laws of the City and State are complied with in the vicinity of the said saw mill community. On motion by D.A. Campbell, seconded by W. A. Abney it was unanimously carried that ~~that~~ the City Manager should grant the issuance of such special officers Commission as asked for. The City Manager was instructed to notify B.L. Zeagler that his request had been granted and for him to have his man, Mr. J.W. Chamblee report to the City Hall for purpose of qualifying as such special officer.

The matter again was brought to attention of the City Commission by the Mayor that R.C. Chancey, Chief Police, had not returned to Red Johnson pistol he had heretofore been instructed to return. The City Manager was instructed to instruct the said R.C. Chancey to either return the pistol to the said Red Johnson or to resign his position as Chief Police of the City of Lufkin, Texas.
