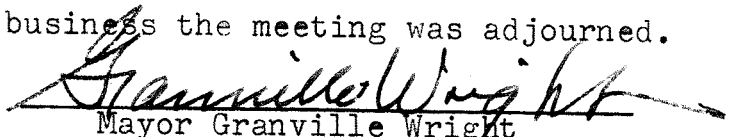

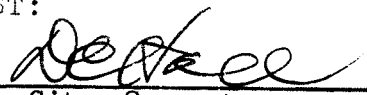
A quorum being present, The following business was transacted.

1. The minutes of the previous meeting held December 16, 1952 were read and approved.
2. Application for zone changes of Lufkin Foundry and Machine Company for two lots, one on South Raguet and one on Kiln Street were passed on ~~first~~ reading. There being no opposition. motion Stegall, seconded by Nerren, all voting "Aye".
3. The zone change application of Gresham Temple and Dewey Holland for tract of land on West Side of Timberland Drive at intersection of Laurel Street, was approved on ~~first~~ reading. Motion Stegall, Seconded by Nerren, all voted "Aye".
4. The council passed ordinance, on second reading, cancelling the existing Franchise of the United Gas Corporation, which was to expire in June 1954, and granting United Gas Corporation, new Franchise to extend for a period of 25 years from this date. Motion Zeagler, Seconded by Stegall, all voted "Aye".
- 5 On Motion of Stegall, and Seconded by Zeagler, all voting "Aye", the Council passed new Plumbing Ordinance, for the City of Lufkin, on first reading. This ordinance to be the same as the National Plumbing Code.
- 6 On Motion of Stegall, and Seconded by Nerren, all voting "Aye", the Council officially named the New Highway 69, Loop from Intersection of North Timberland Drive to Highway 69, at Keltys as Kurth Drive.
7. On Motion of Stegall, and Seconded by Zeagler, the Council voted to send one Police Student to the Police Academy, of Texas A & M College for a four week period at a cost of \$65.00. All voted "Aye".

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
