Dr P.R. Dimman presented a petition to council, praying that new franchise be granted the Lufkin Telephone and the Lufkin Light & Power — Motion by Benson seconded by Singleton, and all voting aye except Coccuorgan that the matter be tabled until a future meeting

L.H. Gray water canon submitted report and profile which was approved, showing $115\frac{1}{2}$ ft - 4" and 1275 ft 2 1/2" water mains ~~laid~~ increasing two fire hydrants ^{laid} on Parker Avenue.
