Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of January, A.D. 1934, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission in and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of all meetings held since the regular meeing of the City Commission in December, 1933 were read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read:-

K. Morgan appeared before the City Commission and made request that the said City Commission pay to him a sum of about \$30.00, which he claims was eropeously assessed against him for street paving on Lufkin Avenue which said amount he had paid. He says he does not own the property against which the paving assessment was made. The matter was taken under consideration for further study and was passed without action. ----000----

Other things pertaining to the City's business was discussed, especially that of the securing of the necessary right of way for the extension of Denman Avenue across Wilson et als property, and also the North Raguet Street Extension. C.A. Burke and D.A. Campbell who had been appointed to see J.E. Wilson and if possible make a trade with him for the necessary right of way through his property, reported that he had made two propositions, one for a flat price of \$5,500.60 for the right of way onley, and another for \$10,500.00 for a complete sell out of all the property where the homestead is located and two houses on Angelina avenue and the land only located on the south side of the right of way of the new street and also right of way only through lots four and five in Block No. two of the Amgelina County Lumber Company Addition. After considering the two proposition it was decided to accept his propesition at the price of \$10,500.00.

Bills and accounts due by the city to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that such of said bills and accounts as had been property approved for payment by the City Manager should be paid, by move and second duly made and carried they were allowed.
