**An Ordinance**

Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Lufkin, Texas, that it shall be unlawful for any "hawker," "huckster," "cheap John," peddler or other person to sell goods, wares or merchandise by public outcry, or private sale, in or upon the squares, streets, alleys or sidewalks of the city of Lufkin and any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than five dollars and not more than twenty-five dollars.

**An Ordinance**

Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Lufkin, Texas, that if any employee or agent of any railway company within the corporate limits of the city of Lufkin, Texas, shall blow or cause to be blown the whistle on any locomotive, within said corporate limits, except when actually necessary to do so, and in conformance with the rules and regulations of the said railway company, they shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than ten dollars and not more than twenty-five dollars. Provided, that any agent or employee of any railway company who shall blow the whistle of a locomotive to sound the alarm of fire shall not be deemed guilty of violating the provisions of this ordinance.
